As we approach the end of Week 5, it has been absolutely delightful to see the continued, vibrant nature of the students as they interact in the yard, as well as their engagement in classrooms. I witness each day, high quality teaching and learning through our staff and students. We have a

strong focus at Modbury School on catering for the needs of each individual and we aim to engage students in learning that provides cognitive stretch, but does not put the student into a panic phase. Your child's teacher continually monitors and identifies student's different phases of learning and I encourage you to have a daily conversation with your child about where they feel they are sitting within this cycle. Some great ways to start this conversation is by asking them, "Tell me 2 positive things that happened at school today" and "What was a learning task you did today, where you felt stretched?"

NAPLAN Testing for all Year 3 and 5 students commences on Wednesday 15th March (Week 7). The test can often be an area of angst for our students, but there is no need for it to be. We look at it as another mechanism to identify where and how we can further assist students to develop the necessary knowledge and skills to continue to be successful along their lifelong learning journey. It is vitally important that all students identified in these year levels participate in the test and is present and on time to school for Week 7 and 8. There are many ways that you can support your child with this, including: reassuring them, that it is to assist the teachers in supporting their learning, ensure your child gets plenty of rest and sleep during the testing time, have a healthy breakfast each morning of the test, have a drink bottle and plenty of fresh fruit and vegetables packed that can give them energy throughout the day.

The Australian Research Alliance for Children and Youth (ARACY) has worked with children and young people to identify what they felt they needed to live a 'good life'. The group defined 6 interconnected areas which support wellbeing.

The six areas are: • Being valued, loved, and safe • Having basic materials • Being healthy • Engaged in learning • A positive sense of identity and culture • Participating.

Participating is about children and young people having and using their voice, being listened to, and taken seriously within their community. It means having a say in decisions that impact them, and being empowered to speak out and express themselves.

Participating includes involvement with peers and groups through a variety of activities, and this year we are excited to offer more opportunities for the students at Modbury to **participate**. Students from LCB and LCC who are interested in roles of responsibility have been given the opportunity to join a committee and develop their leadership skills.
