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#### Innovations in Learning

What does innovation in learning look and feel like at Modbury School P-6? Innovation in education is the process by which we improve teaching and learning using new and creative ideas and technologies.

At Modbury School we value and respect that the learning process is different for every child. In the same way that every adult likes to receive information in a variety of ways or have flexibility during their work day, we know that children also require the same considerations.

For children, learning is the work they do, and it is important that we have a process that undergoes constant review to ensure we are supporting their current needs. Approaching learning in innovative ways helps to engage, motivate and enhance the social, emotional and educational outcomes of students.

For students at Modbury this can look like:

- Individualised learning plans, identifying strengths and areas requiring additional support
- Blended learning programs, face to face teaching, online programs and a combination of technology based lessons, with teacher supported instructions
- Flexible seating to accommodate the different styles of learners
- Movement breaks and interoception activities
- Project based learning activities to stimulate inquiry, develop critical thinking and teamwork capabilities
- Gamification: Using gaming elements and physical game play to build connections and transpose information learnt to another learning area
