Volunteering as a Governing Council Member

One of the important ways in which our volunteers support Modbury School is through the Governing Council. Many parents ask about the roles and responsibilities of a Governing Council member. Here is some information about what Governing Council (GC) is and some successful projects that Modbury School Governing Council have been involved in.



Governing Council is an elected body of parents that meet twice a term to represent the wider school community. They work

with the Principal around matters of 'governance' in the school. Things that cover 'governance' include:

- Looking and reviewing current school polices (eg- Anti-bullying, Sun-safe, grievance procedures etc.)
- Fundraising for our students (your children) so we can continually improve our facilities/ equipment (FUNdraising committee)
- Oversight of our OSHC
- Oversight of the schools Learning Improvement plan
- Oversight of our school's finances (finance committee).

Our Governing Council has been very active in helping to improve our school in many ways. It's a very relaxed and informal forum and you don't have to have had any experience; just be a parent! The Department for Education also offers online training for those that would like some formal training on the roles and responsibilities of a Governing Council member.

Modbury School Governing Council has been directly involved in the following outcomes for our school?

- Review and approval of our School, Preschool and Out of Hours School Care Policies
- Liaison with TTG Council
- Working in collaboration with leadership for site improvement initiatives
- Grant applications
- Fundraising events

If you can spare approximately 2 hours, twice a term to help support your children's school, please consider joining as a member of Governing Council.

Meetings are held in an informal, relaxed atmosphere and your contributions add to the decision making process of the school.

Nominations for Governing Council members are held as part of Annual General Meeting (AGM). After the AGM business we will ask for volunteers to join our GC. If you can't attend the AGM, then please email your interest to the front office and we can get in touch with you.

Nomination forms for Governing Council will be sent to families before the end of term and again early in 2024.

Modbury School Peace Pole

donated by the Rotary Club



This pole was unveiled at a special assembly on Monday. The **Peace Pole** program had its beginnings in 1955. You can now find Peace Poles in close to 200 countries with more than 250,000 placed around the world.

The Rotary Club of Adelaide aims to distribute 100 Peace Poles in recognition of the 100 years of Rotary in South Australia 2023-24.

Peace Poles are set into the earth, with the Universal Peace Message 'May Peace Prevail on Earth' written on each side in four languages. They symbolise our common wish for a world at peace. They stand as a silent vigil, reminding us to think and act in the spirit of peace.

Modbury School Peace Pole message "May Peace Prevail on Earth" has been written in English, Kaurna, Hindi and Sign Language. We will add additional languages to the pole over time. During

our ceremony we reflected on the message written by the Chinese philosopher Laozi over 2500 years ago. If there is to be peace in the world, there must be peace between nations.

• If there is to be peace between nations, there must be peace in the cities.

• If there is to be peace in the cities, there must be peace between neighbours.



- If there is to be peace between neighbours, there must be peace in the home.
- If there is to be peace in the home, there must be peace in the heart.

The area surrounding our Peace Pole has been planted with native hibiscus, which are found widely across Australia and a symbol of the strength and resilience of our First Nation people. These flowers are purple in colour which symbolises compassion and spiritual healing and is widely recognised as a

colour peace and reconciliation. These formation of the petal in these flowers symbolises the scattering of the stolen generation and the resilience of our First Nations people.

We would like to thank Rob Carthaw as representative from the Rotary Club and our Governing Council chairperson, Ben Kempster for sharing this very special event with our school community.
