I liked sitting next to Violet on the bus ride in to the city. I liked seeing the stuffed animals because they looked real. - Charlie











educational skills in a less formal way. Literacy activities included sequencing and procedure writing. Procedure writing is an important skill for children to master as it is a helpful way of learning how to do something new. It teaches them to write informatively and improves problem solving and critical thinking. Students enjoyed the hands on experience of making and enjoying the fairy bread!















Numeracy activities included, looking at shapes, estimating (how many sprinkles on a piece of bread?), and fractions.

Students were required to work together to make the fairy bread, share it equally and for some, they needed to try something new.

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
